Since late September, when engine and financial issues stranded this vessel at anchor, BISC has stayed in communication with International Transport Workers Federation's hard-working inspector Barbara Shipley, the Coast Guard, and Seafarers International Union Port Agent Elizabeth Brown. Much of our work was coordinating donations (kindly stored by SIU) and fielding offers. These included internet provided by

Believe, TV's from James Bartlett and from Apostleship of the Sea, rosaries from Emmanuel Episcopal, warm clothes and toiletries collected by BISC's own ecumenical personnel (Episcopal, Baptist, Presbyterian, Lutheran), phone cards and more warm clothes paid for by Inter Orient (manning agency), and abundant warm clothes and food from generous Marylanders.

Thanks to McAllister Towing, the Maryland Pilots, and Steinweg Terminal, Mary visited the crew six times to listen, pray, deliver necessities and family care packages, and escort a relative on board. McAllister, the Maryland Pilots, and Vane Brothers facilitated numerous other deliveries. Meanwhile, BISC and AOS volunteers continued their long and faithful hours assisting others of the 2,000 crews who dock Baltimore annually.

The Sorrows of Ship Visits . . .

BISC's ministry to seafarers in distress, whether an entire crew (p. 1) or individuals, is ecumenical. A Lutheran volunteer offered compassionate listening to a seafarer who had been part of an unsuccessful rescue attempt at sea. A week later, our Baptist pastor prayed with a seafarer whose wife had died suddenly; the next day,

a Roman Catholic volunteer brought him a rosary. That same day, a conversation was begun by an Episcopal chaplain and continued by a Presbyterian volunteer, with a seafarer who had lost several former crewmates in a vessel collision.



Our annual retreat, kindly hosted by St. Thomas' Church in Towson, included prayers for seafarers in distress and checking in about lighter topics.


